

Glen Park Izaak Walton Indoor Pistol Range Rules



Each shooter is required to observe and comply with all range rules. If in doubt contact the range officer. As a firearms owner/user you are responsible for your actions. **Any Member violating any rule is subject to having their range privileges revoked or expulsion from the Glen Park Chapter.** The President, Range Master, or Board of Directors reserves the right to close the Range at their discretion.

- 1) Range hours are **7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.** daily. The Range is closed during specified events and monthly Club meetings. (7:30pm on 2nd Monday of the month)
- 2) All users of the Indoor Range and Archery Range **MUST** sign in to the Range Log Book and pay the appropriate fee. You must enter the TIME IN and the TIME OUT along with the date, and which Range you are using. Check which type of Firearm(s) you will use on the Range.
- 3) No alcoholic beverages are to be used on any of the Ranges or consumed before entering any of the Ranges.
- 4) Safety glasses and Hearing Protection is required on ALL Ranges.
- 5) Range use is for Members and their Guests only. The Rangemaster shall approve special groups, exhibitions, or live fire demonstrations.
- 6) National Rifle Association rules of safety and conduct will apply to all shooters.
- 7) Anyone under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- 8) A Member may bring a Guest TWICE - Guests must also sign the Range Book and pay the appropriate fee. Guests must be accompanied by a Member. In order to use the Range after that the Guest must become a Member.
- 9) It is requested that no shooter be on the Range alone. Please use the Range in pairs for safety and neatness of the Range.
- 10) Only paper targets shall be used and mounted in front of the Backstop in the proper position.
- 11) Normal velocity, factory type, and hand loaded ammunition shall be used. Certain Magnum Cartridges shall be allowed and are listed on the attached pages. Do not exceed 1,000 ft-lb of kinetic energy (K.E.) for any load. Generally under 500 ft.-lb. of K.E. is preferred.
- 12) NO .460 S&W Magnum, .50 Action Express(A.E.), .454 Casull, .475 Linebaugh, .480 Ruger, and .500 S&W Magnum are allowed.
- 13) No Rifle Calibers in a Handgun are allowed.
- 14) Rifles that are allowed are limited to .22 Short, Long, Long Rifle, and Rim Fire Magnum. Rifles in .17 Mach 2 and .17 HMR are allowed. However .17 Remington or other Center Fire Rifle are not allowed.
- 15) Rifles that are capable of firing Standard Velocity Center Fire Pistol cartridges such as .38 Special, 9mm, .40 S&W, and .45 ACP are allowed.
- 16) Shot Shell type hand gun loads, Shotgun Shells or Shotguns Slugs are not allowed.
- 17) No black powder firearms allowed.
- 18) Shooters shall not shoot closer than the 25-foot line (red line).
- 19) Shoot at your own risk. Club shall not be liable for any injuries or death. Use common sense!!!
- 20) No smoking inside the indoor range.
- 21) Loaded Guns are limited to the Range(s) ONLY (Except for LTCH/Permit Holders.)
- 22) Absolutely no full automatic or bump stock equipped firearms allowed.

- 23)** Any trigger mechanisms that allow a firearm to fire fully automatic or simulated automatic operation is strictly prohibited.
- 24)** If other Shooters are present, you may use the Range for 45 minutes only - in order to let other fellow Members a chance to shoot.
- 25)** If people are shooting when you arrive, knock on the door and wait for acknowledgement and a cease fire before entering the range.
- 26)** If you are in the range when people arrive, cease fire and let them know it is clear to enter.
- 27)** As soon as firearms are unpacked, open cylinders and lock slides back to ensure firearms are empty. If a carry sidearm is to be fired, unload it or keep it holstered. Firearms are only to be loaded in the shooting booth. When guns are not in use, magazines are out of the gun and the actions are OPEN (except for Open Bolt Guns).
- 28)** When moving a firearms from the work bench to the shooting booth, do not sweep the muzzle past other shooters or any part of yourself. It is recommended that you have the muzzle pointing straight down. The same applies when moving a firearms from the shooting booth back to the work bench.
- 29)** Always keep muzzles pointed down range at the shooting booth.
- 30)** Confirm that everyone has hearing and eye protection on prior to beginning to shoot.
- 31)** When going down range to inspect or replace targets, announce to all shooters your intentions and confirm that they have each heard you and understand.
- 32)** When anyone is down range, all firearms should have the action open and be unloaded. No firearms should be touched while anyone is down range. No loaded guns are allowed in the shooting booths when someone is setting targets (down range).
- 33)** Please clean up. After you finish shooting, please clean-up the Range including targets and spent cartridges. Sweep and put brass and casing in the brass recycling bucket and paper targets in the recycle can. There is also a garbage can for non-recyclable materials. If the garbage or recycle cans are full there are garbage and recycle dumpsters outside.
- 34)** Shut off range lights, exhaust fans, and close the range door when you leave.
- 35)** Any damage to the range is to be reported to the Range Master immediately.
- 36)** Unsafe shooting and lack of judicious marksmanship will not be tolerated.
- 37)** Shooters guilty of range damage will be held accountable for their actions.
